O P I N I O N

Sequoia Stages possesses authority to render service as a passenger stage corporation between Lafayette and Orinda Village and intermediate points (Decision No. 54298 in Application No. 38355).

Applicant requests authority to discontinue service during the summer vacation period from June 15, 1957 to September 9, 1957, alleging that operation of daily service during such period would result in a substantial loss because most of the passengers are school children or students attending St. Mary's College; and that only one or two passengers would be affected by such suspension.

Under the circumstances here shown the Commission is of the opinion that the application should be granted. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

Application having been made and the Commission being of the opinion that authority requested should be granted,

IT IS ORDERED:

- (1) That Sequoia Stages is authorized to suspend service until September 9, 1957.

(2) That applicant, within fifteen days after the effective date of this order and on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public, shall supplement its tariffs and time schedules showing the suspension of service herein authorized.

(3) That applicant shall, not less than five days prior to the suspension of service hereinabove referred to, post notices thereof in all its passenger stage vehicles.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
