OPINION

Jack 0. Murch is engaged in the transportation of property in California pursuant to permits issued by this Commission.

Applicant socks an order authorizing him to conduct service as a highway common carrier for the transportation of general commodities between points in an area defined in said application as the Los Angeles Region and between such points, on the one hand, and Santa Ana, Riverside, San Bernardino, Redlands and various intermediate points, on the other hand.

Notice of filing of the application was given all common carriers subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.

A public hoaring was held at Los Angeles on May 14, 1957 before Examinor Carl Silverhart.

Protestant did not prosent any testimony but engaged in cross-examination of applicant's witness.

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- (2) That in providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:
 - (a) Within thirty days after the effective date horoof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate horoin granted. By accepting the certificate of public convenience and necessity herein granted, applicant is placed on notice that he will be required, among other things, to file annual reports of his operations and to comply with and observe the safety rules and other regulations of the Commission's General Order No. 99. Failure to file such reports, in such form and at such time as the Commission may direct, or to comply with and observe the provisions of General Order No. 99, may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.
 - (b) Within sixty days after the effective date horoof, and on not less than ton days' notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file in triplicate, and concurrently make effective, tariffs satisfactory to the Commission.

The offective date of this order shall be ninety days after the date hereof.

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Appondix A Jack O. Murch Original Page 1 Jack O. Murch, by the cortificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to transport general commodities between all points in the territory more particularly described in Appendix B hereto attached. Applicant shall not transport any shipments of: 1. Used household goods and personal effects not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in paragraph (d) of Item No. 10-C of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 4-A. 2. Automobiles, trucks and buses, viz.: new and used, finished or unfinished passenger automobiles (including jeops), ambulances, hearses and taxis; froight automobiles, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trailers combined, buses and bus chassis. 3. Livostock, viz.: bucks, bulls, calves, cattle, cows, dairy cattle, ewes, goats, hogs, horses, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags or swine. 4. Commodities requiring the use of special refrig-cration or temporature control in specially designed and constructed refrigerated equipment. 5. Liquids, compressed gases, commodities in semi-plastic form and commodities in suspension in liquids in bulk, in tank trucks, tank trailers, tank semitrailers or a combination of such highway vehicles. 6. Commodities when transported in bulk in dump trucks or in hopper-type trucks. 7. Commodities when transported in motor vehicles oquipped for mechanical mixing in transit. APPENDIX B TO DECISION NO. 55203
