OPINION

R. F. Guthrie is engaged in the transportation of property in California pursuant to permits issued by this Commission.

Applicant seeks an order authorizing him to conduct service as a highway common carrier for the transportation of food products, building materials, chemicals, machinery and related products between points in Southern California and between those and cortain San Joaquin Valley and northern points.

Notice of filing of the application was given all common carriers subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.

A public hearing was held at Los Angeles on May 15, 1957 before Examiner John Power.

Protestants assisted in developing the record by cross-examination and argument.

Upon consideration of the allegations of the application, the representations filed pursuant to the above-mentioned notice

By accepting the certificate of public convenience and necessity herein granted, applicant is placed on notice that he will be required, among other things, to file annual reports of his operations and to comply with and observe the safety rules and other regulations of the Commission's General Order No. 99. Failure to file such reports, in such form and at such time as the Commission may direct, or to comply with and observe the provisions of General Order No. 99, may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision. (b) Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than ten days! notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file in triplicate, and concurrently make effective, tariffs satisfactory to the Commission.
