GH 50325 Decision No. HEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA In the Matter of the Application of LINCOLN PROPERTIES, INC., a corporation, for a certificate of Application No. 39126 public convenience and necessity authorizing a rerouting of present routes for transportation of passengers. <u>OPINION</u> This application filed June 5, 1957, requests a modification of routes to conform with the one-way street ordinance of the City of Stockton. The request is for modification of Decision No. 45838, dated June 19, 1951, in Application No. 32259, as modified. The certificate issued by this decision was revoked and rescinded and a new certificate was issued to this applicant by Decision No. 52734, dated March 6, 1956, in Application No. 37550. The requested relief will be granted by amending the route description in Appendix A attached to and made a part of said Decision No. 52734. A public hearing is unnecessary. In order to expedite compliance with future changes in local one-way street requirements, applicant will also be authorized to comply therewith temporarily as provided in the following order. An application therefor having been filed and duly considered by the Commission and it finding that public convenience and necessity so require, IT IS OR DERED: (1) That Decision No. 52734, dated March 6, 1956, in Application No. 37550 is amended by changing Appendix A thereto attached so that it reads and provides as indicated in Appendix A attached hereto and -1made a part of this decision.

- (2) That said Decision No. 52734 is further amended by adding thereto a new ordering paragraph to be numbered (4) as follows:
 - (4) That applicant is authorized to temporarily alter any of its routes so as to comply with any applicable one-way street requirement as provided in any city or county ordinance hereafter adopted provided applicant shall file an application with the Commission within thirty days after such temporary route change requesting that such change become permanent.

The effective date of this decision shall be the date hereof.

First Revised Page 1 Cancels Original Page 1 Lincoln Properties, Inc., by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the above-numbered decision as amended by decision in Application No. 39126 is authorized to transport passengers between Stockton, California, on the one hand, and Colonial Heights, a subdivision in county territory north of said city, on the other hand, serving intermediate points. Subject to the authority of this Commission to change or modify such at any time, Lincoln Properties, Inc., shall conduct said passenger stage operation over and along the following described route: Between Stockton and Colonial Heights commencing at the intersection of Paloma Avenue and Pershing Avenue over and along Paloma Avenue, Thornton Road, Pershing Avenue, Rivera, Andrea Avenue, Meadow Avenue, Caran Avenue, Lincoln Road, Gettysburg Place, Rutledge Way, Vicksburg Place, Douglas Road, Leesburg Place, Rutledge Way, Harrisburg Place, Polk Way, Williamsburg Place, Benjamin Holt Drive, Alexandria Place, Swain Road, Pacific Avenue to Castle Street Pacific Avenue to Castle Street. Also between the intersection of Pacific Avenue and Castle Street in the City of Stockton and the intersection of East Weber Avenue and North Hunter Street in said city when the buses are operating in a southerly direction over and along Pacific Avenue, Maple Street, Center Street, East Oak Street, and North Hunter Street and when the buses are operating in a northerly direc-tion over and along East Weber Avenue, El Dorado Street and Castle Street. Applicant may turn its motor vehicles at termini or intermediate points either in an intersection of streets or by operating around a block, in either direction, contiguous to such intersection.
