O P I N I O N

Item 610 series of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 is a description of articles included in the term "canned goods and other articles" for which exception ratings and commodity rates are established in other items in the said tariff.<sup>1/</sup>

By petition filed January 7, 1957, as amended May 21, 1957, Kraft Foods Company requests amendment of Item 610 series to include:

Sandwich spreads, including cheese spreads, in packages named or in paper cartons in boxes; macaroni and cheese, in combined packages in boxes; beverages, flavored or phosphated, not including extracts, syrups nor alcoholic liquors, not carbonated, in tin.

By Petition filed April 29, 1957, American Home Foods, Division of American Home Products Corporation, requests revision of Item 610 series to include:

Pizza pie mix, consisting of flour, yeast and sauce, with or without cheese, in combined packages, in boxes.

By petition filed April 30, 1957, Foremost Dairies, Inc. requests revision of Item 610 series to include:

Whey, condensed or powdered, packed according to Western Classification requirements.

The petitions were consolidated for hearing and decision. Public hearing was held May 21, 1957, before Examiner Jack E. Thompson at San Francisco when the matters were taken under submission.

By petition filed May 18, 1957, Best Foods, Inc. requests amendment of Item 610 to include:

Oil, cooking, olive or salad.

Olive oil and salad oil are presently included in Item 610. The petition seeks the addition of cooking oil to the list of commodities taking canned goods rates. Hearing was not held on this petition.

For convenience herein the evidence will be discussed separately with respect to the individual commodities involved.

#### Cheese Spreads

Kraft Foods Company markets and ships processed cheese products known as cheese spreads. They are sold in glass and in boxes which when shipped are packed in outer containers. In its shipping form the value per gross pound ranges from 23.1 cents to 44.7 cents. The density ranges from 37.1 pounds to 56.3 pounds per cubic foot. According to the division traffic manager of the company, the articles are used as sandwich spreads and compete with articles

included under sandwich spreads in Item 610 series of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2. Petitioner also manufactures and ships a sandwich spread, the value per gross pound and the density of which are similar to those of the cheese spreads. The petitioner ships the cheese spreads in mixed shipments with the sandwich spread and other articles listed in Item 610 series.

#### Macaroni and Cheese

Kraft Foods Company markets a product it calls "Kraft Dinner". As it is retailed, it consists of a 7 $\frac{1}{2}$  ounce paper box containing macaroni and a small bag of grated cheese. In its shipping container the density and the value of the product are 20.2 pounds per cubic foot and 25.9 cents per pound, respectively. Petitioner states that its Kraft Dinner is in direct competition with semi-prepared or ready-to-cook "dinners" of which the basic ingredient is spaghetti. The latter are included in Item 610 series under the description "spaghetti and cheese, with sauce" in combined packages in boxes. It was pointed out that spaghetti is a macaroni product and that the only difference between macaroni and spaghetti is the diameter of the respective products.<sup>2/</sup>

#### Beverages

Kraft Food Company markets products called "Kraft Orange Drink" and "Kraft Grape Drink". They are sold in 46-ounce tin containers. According to the division traffic manager of petitioner, the products are placed on shelves in stores along with fruit juices packed in similar containers. They compete with fruit juices rather than beverages of the type usually considered as "soda pop". The products have the same transportation characteristics as fruit juices

Food and Drug Administration (20 F.R. 9575, December 20, 1955) macaroni is the macaroni product the units of which are tube-shaped and more than 0.11 inch but not more than 0.27 inch in diameter. Spaghetti is the macaroni product the units of which are tube-shaped or cord-shaped (not tubular) and more than 0.06 inch but not more than 0.11 inch in diameter.

in 46-ounce tin containers except that the value per pound is somewhat less. From the evidence it appears that the products consist basically of concentrated fruit juice and water. Additives such as Vitamin "C" and fruit derivatives are included in small amounts. The generic term used by the industry to describe these beverages appears to be "Fruit Drink". The Commission is aware that producers other than petitioner market similar beverages in 46-ounce containers such as "Pineapple Drink" and "Pineapple and Grapefruit Drink".

Pizza Pie Mix

The commodity here under consideration consists of a six-ounce paper bag of edible flour, five grams of yeast in a foil wrapper, one and one-half ounces of grated cheese in a tin container. All are packed in a single package which weighs approximately one pound. As packed for shipment the product has a density of 34.2 pounds per cubic foot and a value of 29.7 cents per pound. The density and value as well as other transportation characteristics are substantially the same as another product manufactured by American Home Foods Division, namely, spaghetti and cheese, with sauce. The latter as well as all of the products other than pizza pie mix made by the petitioner presently enjoy the ratings and commodity rates of canned goods. Petitioner usually ships pizza pie mix in mixed shipments with the other products.

Representatives of two highway carriers testified that shipments of pizza pie mix possess transportation characteristics as favorable as, or more favorable than, many of the canned goods which are subject to the ratings here sought. According to the witness the shipments load and stack easily and afford optimum utilization of the equipment. It was further stated that since they commenced transporting the product over a year ago there has been no claim expense on shipments of pizza pie mix.

Petitioner's traffic manager states that to his knowledge only one other manufacturer markets pizza pie mix in California. According to his testimony the competitor's product has virtually the same transportation characteristics as petitioner's. One difference is that the competitive pizza pie mix does not include cheese in the package. It was for this reason that the proposed description provides "with or without cheese".

Whey

Whey is a by-product of the processing of milk. According to the assistant to the traffic manager of Foremost Dairies, Inc., the by-product, if not condensed or dried for commercial use, becomes a nuisance problem at the processing plant and requires disposal, either by public sewage or an expensive private disposal operation. Foremost Dairies, Inc. is presently drying whey and making a feed grade of the product. It intends to prepare, as is being done elsewhere, dried and condensed whey for food purposes. Because whey is the one major milk product that does not receive a subsidy or price support from the government and because its price is one of the lowest for a food product it is contended that in order to develop a market it is necessary that whey be accorded freight rates as low as the products with which it will compete, namely, nonfat dry milk solids.

According to the testimony, other than having a lower value, dried or condensed whey has the same transportation characteristics as its milk counterparts. It also has the same uses as nonfat dry milk solids, namely, as an ingredient in various food products such as bakery goods, cheese, ice cream, soups, candy, soft drinks, meat products and others.

It was stated that whey has a large potential market. California ranks second in the country in the manufacture of cheese.

It is urged that the market for this by-product of cheese can be developed only under proper freight rates.

Cooking Oil

Best Foods, Inc., in its petition, states that cooking oil and salad oil are practically identical and that salad oil is also used extensively as cooking oil. Petitioner referred to several freight tariffs applicable in the Pacific Coast area and to the consolidated classification wherein salad oil and cooking oil are carried in the same items and are subject to the same rates or ratings. Petitioner mailed a copy of its petition to several of its competitors and to the California Trucking Associations, Inc. The Commission has not been informed of any opposition to the granting of the petition. A public hearing in this matter is not necessary.

The petitioners have shown that the products involved herein compete with commodities included in Item 610 series and have similar transportation characteristics as those competitive commodities. It was also shown that the shipper of such products usually and ordinarily ship such articles with canned goods. The Commission is of the opinion and finds that the ratings and commodity rates on canned goods are reasonable for the transportation of the products here involved when packed in the containers specified in the respective petitions.

It appears that, except in the cases of orange drink and grape drink, the commodity descriptions proposed by petitioners are adequate to cover the articles involved and do not encompass a broader field of products than those specified in the proceedings. As mentioned above, the fruit drinks are more closely related to fruit juices than to soda pop. There has been no showing herein that soda pop type beverages, not carbonated, in tin should be accorded the canned goods rates and ratings although the commodity description

proposed would provide the articles with such rates and ratings. It would appear that a more restrictive description of the fruit drinks should be provided.

It also appears that the packaging and container requirement for whey should be no different than the requirement set forth in Item 610 for the competitive products of milk and dry milk solids.

Modified to the extent mentioned above, the Commission concludes that the changes in Item 610 proposed by the petitioners should be adopted.

O R D E R

Based on the findings and conclusions set forth in the preceding opinion,

IT IS ORDERED:

1. That Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 (Appendix "D" to Decision No. 31606, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective September 15, 1957, the revised pages attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof, which pages are numbered as follows:

2. That tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the tariff changes herein involved.

3. In all other respects said Decision No. 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
