In the Matter of the Application of Wayne Vaughn, an individual doing business under the name of GREEN BUS SERVICE, for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate a limousine service between San Luis Obispo and Paso Robles Airport, for the transportation of passengers and express in the State of California.

OPINION

By this application filed July 5, 1957, Wayne Vaughn requests authority to establish and operate an automotive service for the transportation of passengers, baggage and express between San Luis Obispo and the Paso Robles Airport. Applicant proposes to pick up and discharge air-line passengers at that airport and also at the Anderson Hotel, the Motel Inn in San Luis Obispo, the Carlton Hotel in Atascadero and at the Paso Robles Inn in Paso Robles. A restriction against local service in the territory served by Pacific Greyhound Lines is agreed to. The proposed service is said to be necessary due to the fact that Southwest Airways has discontinued service to San Luis Obispo.

Applicant proposes to operate two round trips daily, meeting the regularly scheduled flights, and additional trips will be made to accommodate special flights. Applicant has an eight-passenger limousine which he will use in this service. Applicant appears to have adequate financial ability and is sufficiently experienced to assure a successful operation. He alleges that he is presently engaged in operating an urban passenger service in and near the lity of San Luis Obispo under authority granted

- a. Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted. By accepting the certificate of public convenience and necessity herein granted, applicant is placed on notice that he will be required, among other things, to file annual reports of his operations and to comply with and observe the safety rules and other regulations of the Commission's General Order No. 98, and provide insurance protection as required by General Order No. 101. Failure to file such reports, in such form and at such time as the Commission may direct, or to comply with and observe the provisions of General Order No. 98 and General Order No. 101, may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.
- b. Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than ten days notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file in triplicate and concurrently make effective tariffs and time schedules, satisfactory to the Commission.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
