OBINION

By this application filed May 27, 1957, Sacramento Northern Railway requests authority to discontinue the agency at Colusa and at Sutter stations. As justification for the request it is alleged that the volume of business on this branch which terminates at Colusa is not sufficient to justify continuance of these two agencies. During 1956 the business at Sutter is alleged to consist of 198 carload shipments of freight forwarded, 78 received and five shipments of lessthan-carload shipments forwarded and four received. At Colusa for that same period the figures show much less business being 20, 82, 0 and 6, respectively.

After due notice public hearing was held in Colusa on July 30, 1957, before Examiner Rowe at which time evidence both oral and documentary was received and the matter submitted for decision.

No passengers are transported over this branch. According to the evidence of record the amount by which the cost of handling Colusa traffic exceeds the revenue during the 12 months ending April 30, 1956, was \$4,416 and ending April 30, 1957, the figure was

Upon full consideration of the facts of record the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the expense of maintenance of applicant's agency at Colusa is not justified; that the service will not be materially affected by the discontinuance of this station as an agency, and that as to such station the application will be granted. As to the Sutter station it appears that the assertion of lack of financial justification for maintaining this station has not been substantiated. The agent at Sutter should be in a better position also to take care of the requirements of the shippers and receivers of freight in the Colusa area more efficiently and economically than the personnel from Yuba City.
