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ORDER OF SUSPENSION

Fabiano Intra-Cal Lines, Inc., a California corporation, is, at the present time, the owner of a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing it to operate as a highway common carrier between certain points in the Los Angeles area. This authority was granted by Decision No. 53086, dated May 15, 1956, in Application No. 35966, as amended. Prior to the formation of the corporation in March 1955 this business was conducted by a partnership consisting of Leonardo, Rosario and Jennie V. Fabiano.

The Commission has been notified that this corporation discontinued operations on or about May 8, 1957 following an assignment for the benefit of creditors. The present assignee for the creditors states in a letter to the Commission that an attempt is being made to sell the business and requests that, in the interim, the above certificate be suspended. This carrier's insurance coverage has been canceled and permits held by Fabiano Intra-Cal Lines, Inc., were suspended until December 17, 1957.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by Decision No. 53086, dated May 15, 1956,

in Application No. 35966, to Fabiano Intra-Cal Lines, Inc., authorizing it to operate as a highway common carrier, is hereby suspended until December 17, 1957. This suspension shall become effective from the date of this decision, provided that this carrier shall, within thirty days after the date of this order and can not not less than one day's notice to the Commission and to the public, amend its tariffs showing the suspension of service as herein ordered.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
