ORDER DENYING PETITION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME
 OF EFFECTIVE DATE OF ORDER

On August 27, 1957, the Commission issued its Decision No. 55476 wherein it found that Trinity Trucking and Timber Company permitted Trinity River Lumber Sales Company to obtain transportation between points within this State at rates less than the minimum rates established by the Commission in violation of Section 3668 of the Public Utilities Code. The decision ordered the trucking company to cease and desist from such practices and further directed that certain amendments to the radial highway common carrier permit of the trucking company be made. The decision provided that it shall become effective twenty days after the date the decision was served on the trucking company.

Prior to this effective date, the trucking company filed a petition requesting an extension of time of this effective date until October 15, 1957. If the Commission granted this petition it would in effect be authorizing Trinity Trucking and Timber Company to continue to violate the provisions of the Public Utilities Code for that extended period. This, the Commission cannot do.

Therefore, it is ordered that the petition for extension of time of the effective date of Decision No. 55476, filed by Trinity Trucking and Timber Company, is hereby denied.
