<u>OPINICN</u>

On March 26, 1957, the Commission issued an order instituting an investigation into the operations, rates and practices of Charles Gilbreth, Sr., Charles Gilbreth, Jr., and N. Gilbreth, doing business as Charles Gilbreth and Sons.

A public hearing was held before Examiner Thomas E. Daly at San Francisco on August 13, 1957 and the matter was submitted.

During the course of hearing, the staff presented witnesses from the Commission's Field Section and Rate Section. The results of their investigation were introduced into the record.

The investigation covered the period from October 1955 to and including February 1956, and the month of June 1956.

The record consists primarily of 37 freight bills and supporting documents, which show violations of the minimum rates resulting in undercharges amounting to \$\psi 547.29\$.

The Commission finds that, in many instances, respondents granted the Selma Dressed Beef Company rebates of 15 percent of the applicable minimum rates. It was stated that respondents purchased two trucks from the Selma Dressed Beef Company with the understanding that respondents would perform said company's transportation service. After the trucks were paid for, a representative of the company informed the respondents that they would suffer the loss of the company's transportation business unless respondents reduced the applicable rates by 15 percent. As found aforesaid, such reduction was granted by respondents.

After consideration, the Commission is of the opinion and so finds that, during the periods here involved, respondents acted in violation of the Public Utilities Code by charging, demanding, collecting and receiving a lesser compensation for the transportation of property than the applicable charges prescribed in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 3. Respondents will be directed to cease and desist from the collection of charges not authorized. Respondents' operating authority will be suspended for five days, and respondents will be directed to collect the undercharges set forth in appendix "A" attached hereto.

ORDER

The Commission having instituted investigation herein, public hearing having been held and the Commission being informed in the premises,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That respondents Charles Gilbreth, Sr., Charles Gilbreth, Jr., and Norman Gilbreth, doing business as Charles Gilbreth and



Sons, cease and desist from charging, demanding, collecting and receiving a lesser compensation for the transportation of property than the applicable charges prescribed in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 3.

- (2) That Highway Contract Carrier Permit No. 10-8419 and Radial Highway Common Carrier Fermit No. 10-5673 issued in the name of respondents are hereby suspended for a period of five consecutive days beginning at 12:01 a.m. on the second Monday following the effective date hereof.
- (3) That respondents shall post in their terminal and station facilities used for receiving property from the public for transportation, not less than five days prior to the beginning of the SUSPENSION PERIOD, a NOTICE to the public stating that their operating authority under their permits has been suspended by the Commission for the period of five days.
- (4) That respondents are directed within twenty days after the effected date of this order:
 - (a) To collect the undercharges indicated upon Appendix "A" attached hereto.
 - (b) To notify the Commission in writing upon the consummation of said collections.
- (5) That in the event the charges to be collected, as provided in paragraph 4 of this order, or any part thereof, remain uncollected eighty days after the effective date of this order, respondents shall submit to the Commission, on Monday of each week, a report specifying the action taken to collect said charges and the results of said action, until said charges have been paid in full or until further order of this Commission.
- (6) That the Secretary of the Commission is directed to cause personal service of this order to be made upon respondents, and
