OPINION

Decision No. 54745, dated March 26, 1957, in Application No. 38826, ordered the suspension for six months of the petroleum irregular route carrier operation under the certificate of public convenience and necessity issued by Decision No. 44630, dated August 8, 1950, in Application No. 31071. This suspension was granted because of the illness of applicant T. W. Lindeman.

The First Supplemental Application, filed August 20, 1957, requests an additional six months' suspension because of the continuance of applicant's illness. After full consideration, the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity will be subserved by granting the present request. We see no need for a public hearing.

ORDER

Application therefor having been filed, the Commission being fully informed therein and good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That T. W. Lindeman is authorized to further suspend his petroleum irregular route carrier operation authorized by said Decision No. 44630 until February 25, 1958.

(2) That on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public, applicant shall file appropriate supplements to his tariffs satisfactory to the Commission reflecting the authority herein granted.

The effective date of this decision shall be five days after the date hereof.
