In the matter of the application of LOS ANGELES COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT, a body corporate and politic, for authority to establish a temporary crossing of SOUTHERN PACIFIC RAILROAD during construction of Los Angeles River from Owensmouth Avenue to Corbin Avenue.

ORDER

Los Angeles County Flood Control District is authorized to construct Mason Avenue as a temporary crossing at grade across the Burbank Branch of Southern Pacific Company in the City of Los Angeles, Los Angeles County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. BY-450.8. authorization is subject to the condition that upon completion of the bridge at Winnetka Avenue and its being opened to public travel, Crossing No. FY-450,8 shall be abandoned and closed. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than 30 feet and grades of approach not greater than six per cent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Frotoction shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (Goneral Order No. 75-B) reflectorized with reflex reflecting material.

A.39192 go Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience. necessity, or safety so require. Because construction of the flood control facilities at Winnetka Avenue is dependent upon diversion of traffic to the Mason Avenue crossing, applicant requests that the order be made effective immediately. For this reason, the effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
