ORDER OF DISMISSAL

By the complaint herein, filed on October 3, 1957, complainant sought restoration of telephone service at 10324 Prairie Avenue, Inglewood, California. On October 17, 1957, the defendant filed an answer in which it alleged, inter alia, that the telephone that complainant seeks to have restored is a nonlisted, nonsubscriber public telephone.

A public hearing was held in Los Angeles on November 18, 1957, before Examiner Kent C. Rogers. At the hearing it was developed that the telephone in question was a nonlisted, nonsubscriber public pay telephone. The complainant thereupon made a motion that the complaint be dismissed.
