A.39646 EL In the present proceeding, applicant now seeks authorization to issue its notes in evidence of the \$17,500 thus advanced by its shareholders. The notes will be unsecured, will be payable on or before three years after the dates of issue and will carry interest at the rate of 6% per annum. A copy of each of the proposed notes is attached to the application. The Commission has considered this matter and is of the opinion that a public hearing is not necessary, that the money, property or labor to be procured or paid for by the issue of the notes herein authorized is reasonably required for the purpose specified herein and that such purpose is not, in whole or in part, reasonably chargeable to operating expenses or to income. The authorization herein granted is for the issue of notes only and is not to be construed as indicative of amounts to be included in a future rate base for the determination of just and reasonable rates. ORDER The Commission having considered the above-entitled application and being of the opinion it should be granted, therefore, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED as follows: 1. Palm Desert Water Company, on and after the effective date hereof and on or before April 30, 1958, may issue four unsecured promissory notes in the aggregate principal amount of not exceeding \$17,500 in the form and for the purpose set forth in this application. **-** 3 -
