ORDER OF DISMISSAL

By the above-entitled complaint, filed on November 13, 1957, Edward M. Blum and Joseph I. Moss, doing business as the Carnival Room, at 7746 Santa Monica Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, allege that on or about June 10, 1957, the defendant came into the premises and removed the coin operated public phone therefrom. On December 2, 1957, the defendant filed an answer in which it alleges that the defendant, prior to June 11, 1957, furnished a non-listed, non-subscriber public telephone at the complainants' premises at 7746 Santa Monica Boulevard, Los Angeles, California.

Inasmuch as both the complainants and the defendant have alleged that the telephone involved was a non-listed, non-subscriber public pay telephone, and the filed rules and regulations of the

defendant specify that such telephones are installed at the discretion of the defendant, and at places chosen by it, and good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that the complaint herein be, and the same hereby is, dismissed. A public hearing is not necessary.
