ORDER

State of California, Department of Public Works, is authorized to construct State Route 17 (U.S. 40) at separated grades under the tracks of Southern Pacific Company, at Newcastle, Placer County, at the location as shown by maps (Exhibit B) attached to the application, to be identified as Crossing No. AI-120.4-B. Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties relative thereto, and copy of said agreement, together with plans of said crossing approved by Southern Pacific Company, shall be filed with the Commission within 180 days from the date hereof. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order. Clearances shall conform to the provisions of General Order No. 26-D. During the time Crossing No. AI-120.3-B (Underpass) is temporarily closed, as stated in the application, to occur between "the middle of September and the following first of June", a crossing flagman shall be provided by applicant at Crossing No. AI-120.2, Newcastle Avenue. Hours of the crossing flagman shall be from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., daily.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order ✓

applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authoriza-
tion shall expire if not exercised within two years unless time be
extended or if conditions are not complied with. The effective date
of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
