INTERIM OPINION AND ORDER

George and Gladys Bumgardner, doing business as George Bumgardner Water Company, applicants herein, have filed this application for a certificate of public convenience and necessity and for authorization to increase rates and to increase their bank borrowings by the sum of \$25,000.

At this time the Commission will give consideration to applicants' request to borrow money. The other matters will be reviewed in a subsequent decision, or decisions, following the completion of hearings to be held at a later date.

George and Gladys Bumgardner are engaged in operating a public utility water system near Modesto, California. They report that they find it necessary to provide an additional supply of water to meet the increasing demands for service and also to connect all dead ends in the distribution systems in order that improved and adequate water service may be available. They estimate the cost of the additions and improvements at approximately \$25,000 and they
