O R D E R

The County of Los Angeles is authorized to widen and improve Aviation Boulevard (Crossing No. 6RA-16.07) at grade across Pacific Electric Railway Company's El Segundo Line in Los Angeles County, at the location described in the application and in accordance with the application as amended February 3, 1958. Construction costs shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between parties of interest, and a copy of the said executed agreement shall be filed with the Commission within 180 days after the effective date of this order. In the event parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion costs by further order. Maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails shall be borne by applicant and between such lines by Pacific Electric Railway Company. Width of crossing shall be not less than 60 feet and grades of approach not greater than one per cent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B).

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year, unless time be

extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

Applicant requests waiver of the 20-day waiting clause so that scheduled work may be started without delay. The effective date of this order shall therefore be the date hereof.
