OPINION AND ORDER

By this application, filed November 7, 1957, Arthur V.

Dettman and Garnett P. Dettman 1/2, seek approval of a lease of their public utility water system, known as Seeley Water System, to Seeley Public Utility District 2/2, and also request authority to sell their water system to District. This system furnishes water service to 85 customers in the unincorporated townsite of Seeley, Imperial County.

The lease, a copy of which is attached to the application, was entered into on August 28, 1952 and continues from month to month until District's pumping plant is in operation. The lease provides for payment by District of a monthly rental of \$50 to Sellers for which Sellers have also agreed to operate the water system. In addition, District has assumed payment of all other maintenance and operating expenses. The application states that the lease is in effect at the present time. Approval of this lease by the Commission has not heretofore been sought.

The terms under which the properties are proposed to be transferred are set forth in an instrument entitled "Bill of Sale",

and Roberta Hurtt by authority granted in Decision No. 40762, dated September 30, 1947, in Application No. 28733. The last annual report filed with this Commission by Sellers was for the year 1952. This report shows total utility plant of \$9,118.53 as of December 31, 1952, and a reserve for depreciation as of this date of \$4,742.13, thus indicating a depreciated utility plant of \$4,376.40 for the water system properties proposed to be transferred.

The application states that District is now and has been furnishing water service in and around Seeley.

The action taken herein shall not be construed to be a finding of the value of properties hereinafter authorized to be leased and transferred.

The Commission having considered the above-entitled application and being of the opinion and finding that the proposed lease and transfer will not be adverse to the public interest, that a public hearing is not necessary, and that the application should be granted; therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

1. Arthur V. Dettman and Garnett P. Dettman, on or after the effective date hereof, are authorized to lease their public utility water system properties, known as Seeley Water System, to Seeley
