O P I N I O N

Callison Truck Lines, Inc., requests authority to transport frozen foods between Sunnyvale and San Francisco, and points intermediate thereto, on the one hand, and points between Garberville and Crescent City which it presently serves, on the other hand.

Applicant alleges that it is engaged in the transportation of frozen foods and has received requests from its customers for the transportation of frozen foods between points south of San Francisco, on the one hand, and points north of Garberville, on the other hand; that the transportation of frozen foods requires careful handling, controlled temperature, expeditious time in transit and it would be more beneficial, where possible, if such frozen foods were transported from origin to destination by a single vehicle without transfer of lading en route.

Copies of the application were served upon carriers in the field and no protest has been received.

After consideration the Commission is of the opinion and so finds that public convenience and necessity require the granting of the authority sought. A public hearing does not appear to be necessary.

O R D E R

Application having been filed and the Commission being fully informed in the premises,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That a certificate of public convenience and necessity is hereby granted to Callison Truck Lines, Inc., authorizing the transportation of property between the points and over the routes set forth in Appendix A attached hereto and made a part hereof.

(2) That, in providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:

- (a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted. By accepting the certificate of public convenience and necessity herein granted, applicant is placed on notice that it will be required, among other things, to file annual reports of its operations and to comply with and observe the safety rules and other regulations of the Commission's General Order No. 99. Failure to file such reports, in such form and at such time as the Commission may direct, or to comply with and observe the provisions of General Order No. 99, may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.

(b) Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file in triplicate, and concurrently make effective, amendments to its tariffs satisfactory to the Commission to reflect the authority herein granted.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
