In the Matter of the Application of) Wayman B. Iindsay and Rodney L. Rogers, doing business as LOCAL FREIGHT CO. to operate a highway common carrier service.

## OPINIQN

Wayman B. Lindsay and Rodney L. Rogers are engaged 14 the transportation of property in Califorala pursuant to permits issued by this Commission.

Applicants seek an order authorizing them to conduct service as a highway comon carrier for the transportation of general comodities with certain exceptions between Los Angeles and Orange County points.

Notice of filing of the application was given all common carriers subject to the jurisdiction of this Comission.

Upon consideration of the allegations of the application and the representations filed pursuant to the above-mentioned notice, the Comission finds that public convenience and necessity require that the application be granted to the extent set forth in the ensuing order. A public hearing is not necessary. It appears that applicant possesses the experience, equipment, personmel and financial resources to institute and maintain the operation authorized herein.

Applicant is hereby placed on notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate fixing for any amount of money in excess of that originally paid to the State
as the consideration for the grant of such rights. Aside from their purely permissive aspect, such rights extend to the bolder a full or partial monopoly of a class of business over a particular route. This monopoly feature may be modified or canceled at any time by the State, which is not in any respect Ifmited as to the number of rights which may be given.

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\underline{O R D E R}
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Based upon the allegations of the application and the exhibits attached thereto and the representations filed herein,

IT IS ORDERED:
(1) That a certifiligate of publilic convenience and necessity Is granted to Wayman B. Inndsay and Rodney L. Rogers, authorizing them t:o operate as a highway common carrier as defined by Section 213 of the Public Utilities Code for the transportation of property between the points and over the routes as more particularly set forth in Appendices $A$ and $B$ attached hereto and made a part hereof.
(2) That in providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicants shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:
(a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicants shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted. By accepting the certificate of public convenience and necessity herein granted, appilcants are placed on notice that they will be required, among other things, to file annual reports of their operations and to comply with and observe the safety rules and other regulations of the Commission's General Order No. 99. Failure to file such reports, in such form and at such time as the Comisision
may direct, or to comply with and observe the provisions of General Order No. 99, may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.
(b) Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than ten days' notice to the Comission and the public, applicants shall establish the service herein authorized and file in triplicate, and concurrently make effective, tariffs satisfactory to the Commission.

The effective date of this order shall be ninety days after the date hereof.


Wayman B. Lindsay and Rodney L. Rogers, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, are authorized to transport general comodities between all points and places in Los Angeles territory as described in Appendix B attached hereto.

Applicant shall not transport any shipments of:

1. Used household goods and personal effects not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in paragraph (d) of Item No. 10-C of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 4-A.
2. Automobiles, trucks and buses, viz.: new and used, Einished or unfinished passenger automobiles (inciuding jeeps), ambulances, hearses and taxis; Ereight automobilos, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trailers combined, buses and bus chassis.
3. Livestock, viz.: bucks, bulls, calves, cattle, cows dairy cattle, ewes, goats, hogs, horses, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, stcers, stags or swine.
4. Comodities requiring the use of special refrigeration or temperature control in specially designed and constructed refrigerated equipment.
5. Liquids, compressed gases, comodities in semiplastic form and comodities in suspension in liquids in bulk, in tank trucks, tank trailers, tank semitralilers or a combination of such highway vehicles.
6. Commodities when transported in bulk in dump trucks or in hopper-type trucks.
7. Comodities when transported in motor vehicles equipped for mechanical mixing in transit.
8. Articles of extraordinary value.
9. Dangerous explosives.
10. Comodities injurious to, or contaminating. to, other lading.

LOS ANGELES TERRITORY includes that area embraced by the following boundary; Beginning at the intersection of Sunset Boulevard and U.S. Highway NO. 101, Alternate; thence northeasterly on Sunset Boulevard to State Highway No. 7; northerly along State Highway No. 7 to State Highway No. i18; northeasterly along State Highway No. 118 through and including the City of San Fernando; continuing northeasterly and southeasterly along State Highway No. 118 to and including the City of Pasadena; easterly along Foothill Boulevard from the intersection of Foothill Boulevard and Michillinda Avenue to Valencia Way; northerly on Valencia Way to Gillcrese Bulevard; easterly and northeasterly along Hillcrest Boulevard to Grant Avenue; easterly and southerly along Grand Avenue to Greystone Avenue; easterly on Greystone Avenue to Oak Park Lane; easterly on Oak Park Lane and the prolongation thereof to the west side of the Sawpit Wash; southerly along the Sawpit Wash to the north side of the Pacific Electric Railway right of way; easterly along the north side of the Racific Electric Railway right of way to Buena Vista Street; south and southerly on Buena Vists Street to its intersection with Meridian Street; due south along on imaginary line to the west bank of the San Gabriel River; Southerly along the west bank of the San Gabriel River to Beverly Boulevard; southeasterly on Beverly Boulevard to Painter Avenue in the City of Whittier; southerly on Painter Avenue to Telegraph Road; westerly on Telegraph Road to the west bank of the San Gabriel River; southerly along the west bank of the San Gabriel River to Imperial Highway; westerly on Imperial Highway to State Highway No. 19; southerly along State Highway No. 19 to its intersection with U. S. Highway No. 101, Alternate, at Ximeno Street; southerly along Ximeno Street and its prolongation to the Racific Ocean; westerly and northerly along the shore line of the Pacific Ocean to a point directly south of the intersection of Sunset Boulevard and U.
