SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

By Decisions Nos. 51595 and 52412, dated June 21, 1955, and December 28, 1955, respectively, the United States of America was authorized to construct two wye track crossings at grade across State Highway Route 78, in the County of Riverside. The orders provided, among other things, that the protection should be two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B) at each crossing and that the authorization would expire if not exercised within one year.

Applicant has filed a petition requesting reinstatement of Decisions Nos. 51595 and 52412, stating that the crossings have not been completed in that the flashing light signals required by said decisions have not been installed.

The petition having been considered, it appears reasonable to reinstate the previous authority, subject, however, to a modification of crossing protection requirements due to changes in conditions since the earlier authorization. Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED:

1. That the sixth sentence (Lines 12 and 13) in the first paragraph of the order in Decision No. 51595, dated June 21, 1955, be amended to read as follows:

"Protection shall be by four Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B) at each of the two crossings."

2. That, except as modified herein, Decisions Nos. 51595 and 52412 are hereby reaffirmed and in full force and effect.

This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
