OPINION AND ORDER

H. E. Steinsick and Blanche Y. Steinsick, by this application filed May 22, 1958, seek authority from the Commission to sell and transfer their public utility water system, known as River Pines Water Service, to Harry Johannesen and Rosceda E. Johannesen who join in the application.

The water system proposed to be transferred is located in the unincorporated community of River Pines, Amador County.

Commission records indicate that as of the end of 1957 the utility served approximately 150 customers.

The terms and conditions of the proposed transfer are set forth in an instrument entitled "Agreement of Purchase and Sale", dated April 15, 1958, a copy of which is attached to the application as Exhibit "A". The properties to be conveyed to purchasers include two parcels of land, easements, several wells, pumping equipment, mains, meters and miscellaneous water system facilities. The consideration for the transfer is to be \$9,700 in cash.

The utility's annual report to the Commission for the year ended December 31, 1957, shows utility plant of \$21,089.15, a

depreciation reserve of \$4,256.91, and a net utility plant of \$16,832.24.

The water system was constructed in the 1930's and found to be a public utility by the Commission in its Decision No. 45010, dated November 8, 1950, in Case No. 5191. The system was purchased by the present owners in 1952 pursuant to authority granted by this Commission in its Decision No. 47496, dated July 22, 1952, in Application No. 33413.

The reason given for the proposed transfer is that Sellers are not able to devote their full time to the operation of the water system whereas Purchasers allege they are willing and able to give the system their full time and attention. Exhibit "C" attached to the application is a financial statement of Purchasers and shows a net worth of \$40,777.23 as of May 14, 1958. It has been concluded from an investigation by an engineer of the Commission's staff that Purchasers are capable of acquiring the water system and continuing its operation as a public utility.

The action taken herein shall not be construed to be a finding of the value of the properties herein authorized to be transferred.

The Commission having considered the above-entitled application and being of the opinion that the proposed transfer will not be adverse to the public interest, that a public hearing is not necessary, and that the application should be granted; therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

1. H. E. Steinsick and Blanche Y. Steinsick may, on or after the effective date hereof and on or before December 31, 1958, sell and transfer their public utility water system, known as River Pines Water Service, to Harry Johannesen and Roseeda E. Johannesen, 6. Upon due compliance with all the conditions of this order, H. E. Steinsick and Blanche Y. Steinsick shall stand relieved of all further public utility obligations and liabilities in connection with the operation of the public utility water system herein authorized to be transferred.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
