Application of the State of California, Department of Public Works, for an order authorizing construction of a temporary crossing at grade over a spur track of the Southern Pacific Company in connection with the improvement of State Route IV-SCL-68-B, SJs.

ORDER

State of California, Department of Public Works, is authorized to construct State Route 68 (U.S. 101) on temporary detour alignment, at grade across a track of Southern Pacific Company near San Jose, Santa Clara County, at the location described in the application to be identified as Crossing No. DA-45.84-C. Construction and maintenance costs shall be borne in accordance with an agreement entered into between the parties relative thereto, or if they fail to agree, the Commission will apportion such costs by further order. Width of crossing and grades of approach shall be as shown in the application. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by the following:

- (1) Installation of two Standard No. 1-A crossing signs (G.O.75-B) or two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (G.O. 75-B) reflectorized with reflexreflective sheet material.
- (2) Installation of two 20,000 lumen mercury vapor lights, one to be located on each vehicular approach side to the track at distances of approximately 40 feet from the track center line and 30 feet in height, said lights to be lighted during the hours of darkness.
- (3) Installation of appropriate signs on the railroad approaches to the crossing indicating a requirement for railroad personnel to stop rail movements before entering the crossing and to flag and protect vehicular traffic on the highway.

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(4) Issuance by the railroad of appropriate bulletin to operating personnel setting forth instructions with respect to above Item (3).

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within two years unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
