## OPINION

By petition filed May 22, 1958, the California Dump Truck Owners Association, Inc. seeks amendment of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 to increase by 22 cents an hour the hourly rates which apply as minimum rates for the transportation of specified materials in dump truck equipment between points in Northern California Territory.

Public hearing on the matter was held before Examiner

C. S. Abernathy at San Francisco on June 26, 1958. Evidence was presented by petitioner through petitioner's manager and through the business agent of the Teamsters' Union in Northern California

Territory. Various interested parties participated in the development of the record through examination of petitioner's witnesses.

The evidence shows that in accordance with labor contracts governing transportation by dump truck equipment in Northern

California the wage rates of drivers were increased by 20 to 25 cents an hour on May 1, 1958. These wage increases are not reflected in the present minimum hourly rates. With the increases in wage rates the carriers' payments for unemployment insurance, social security and compensation insurance have been increased about 1½ cents an hour. These increases likewise are not reflected in the present minimum hourly rates. Petitioner's manager stated that from a review which he made of the carriers' operating costs it appears that no decrease in costs have been experienced which would offset the effect of the increases in wages and related cost items. He said that instead the carriers have experienced other increases in their hourly operating costs largely as a consequence of a decline in the usage of their equipment this year.

No one appeared in opposition to the petition.

In consideration of the showing of increases in carrier operating costs, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the sought increase of 22 cents an hour in the hourly rates has been shown to be justified. The petition will be granted.

It has come to our attention that an error exists in one of the current hourly rates. The error will be corrected.
