ORDER OF DISMISSAL OF PETITION FOR MODIFICATION.

By Decision No. 56965, dated July 8, 1958, in this proceeding, The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company was authorized, subject to the fulfillment of certain conditions specified in the order therein, to discontinue the operation of its passenger Trains Nos. 61 and 6 between Bakersfield and Oakland and intermediate points. By Petition for Modification, filed on August 1, 1958, applicant sought certain modification of the requirements set forth in ordering paragraph 6(c) of the aforementioned decision. The provisions sought to be modified relate to applicant's optional ticket honoring arrangement with Southern Pacific Company.

Public hearing of the Petition for Modification was called by Examiner Carter R. Bishop at San Francisco on August 15, 1958. At the hearing counsel for applicant, speaking on its behalf, requested that said Petition for Modification be dismissed. Therefore, good cause appearing,
