O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company is authorized to abolish by physically closing and barricading two crossings at grade of public roads and the main line of the applicant's railroad in the City and County of San Francisco, California, said roads or streets being known as Irwin Street, the crossing being designated as Crossing No. E-0.89 and Hubbell Street, the crossing being designated as Crossing No. E-0.95, at the locations described in the application. All costs of removal and barricading of the crossing shall be borne by applicant.

The applicant alleges that said crossings may be closed without undue inconvenience to the public, the crossings having been closed recently for a period of approximately three months due to nearby construction activities without any known protests having been made.

By Resolution No. 606-58, approved July 16, 1958, the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco has endorsed this application of Southern Pacific Company.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This

authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
