OPINION ON REHEARING

By this petition the California Dump Truck Owners Association, Inc. seeks amendment of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 to establish zone rates for the transportation of asphaltic concrete from an asphaltic concrete plant in the vicinity of Saugus to various destinations in the San Fernando Valley area. On April 1, 1958, this petition was denied after hearing by Decision No. 56460 for lack of justification. Petitioner has requested further hearing in order to present additional data in support of its proposals. Pursuant to an order of the Commission granting this request, a further hearing was held before Examiner C. S. Abernathy at

Los Angeles on June 10, 1958. Evidence was presented at the further hearing by petitioner's manager and by a representative of the company which owns the asphaltic concrete plant involved.

The asphaltic concrete plant in question was constructed during the summer of 1957 by the Empire Asphaltic Materials Corporation to serve developing needs of the Saugus area and of the western portion of the San Fernando Valley. The facilities represent an investment of approximately one-quarter million dollars. Productive capacity of the plant is about 50,000 tons a month. Normal production for the time being, until the area is further developed, is expected to be about 10,000 tons a month.

Asphaltic Materials Corporation, the San Fernando Valley is the company's principal marketing area. In this area Empire Materials competes with other producers of asphaltic concrete who are located in the Valley. Under present provisions of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 the rates which apply to the shipments of Empire Materials are distance rates. However, the rates which apply to the shipments of Empire's competing producers are zone rates corresponding to those which petitioner seeks herein. Assertedly, the zone rates result in charges which are about 25 cents per ton less than the charges under the distance rates for like distances. This differential places Empire Materials at a substantial disadvantage in relation to its competitors. Also, the distance rates do not provide Empire Materials with the same known and stable basis for bidding for new business that is available to Empire's competitors

The witness for Empire declared that the under the zone rates. lack of a suitable rate structure for the transportation of the company's products has already impaired the development of the company's business. He said that the company is giving consideration to suspension of operations unless its transportation can be performed under more propitious circumstances. With reference to the conditions under which the transportation of the shipments of Empire Materials is performed, the witness said that said conditions and the conditions applicable to transportation from other plants from which zone rates apply are virtually identical. He said that the physical characteristics of the Empire plant are almost the some as those of other plants; that the highway conditions are practically the same, and that Empire Materials is served by some of the same carriers that serve other asphaltic concrete plants in the San Fernando Valley.

Petitioner's manager urged that the zone system of rates be extended to apply to shipments of Empire Materials as sought.

Charges under the distance rates vary according to the length of the route followed by a carrier in making a delivery. Hence, a carrier's charges may be quite different than the charges for which allowance was made in an advance quotation of the delivered price of asphaltic concrete due to the fact that the carrier followed a different route than that over which the quotation was figured.

Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 also provides hourly rates. However, charges under the hourly rates likewise vary according to circumstances of delivery. Consequently the hourly rates also do not provide the known and stable basis of transportation charges assertedly needed by Empire Materials for its operations.

He said that the proposals have been considered by the California Dump Truck Owners Association, Inc., and that it is the opinion of the Association's directors that the circumstances are such that Empire should have available to it the same basis of rates as its competitors. He said that the Association also favors the granting of the petition as a means of furthering the opportunities of forhire dump truck carriers to obtain more business.

Granting of the petition was opposed by the representative of the California Trucking Associations, Inc., on the grounds that the record does not include cost data necessary to the establishment of zone rates. In addition, he urged in effect that the establishment of zone rates be limited to only those zones where there are prospective movements. In this respect he asserted that at present numerous zone rates are being maintained where no actual traffic is involved.

Decision No. 56460 originally denied the petition in this matter on the grounds that on the showing made it did not appear that zone rates as such are necessary to the marketing of the products of Empire Materials and that denial of such rates would not be unduly prejudicial to Empire Materials. Also it did not appear that transportation conditions applicable to the Empire shipments are so similar to those applicable to shipments for which zone rates now apply that the zone system of rates might reasonably be extended. On this fuller record which has been adduced the evidence is clear that Empire Materials is at a serious disadvantage in relation to its competitors because zone rates may not be applied to its shipments. It now appears, furthermore, that the conditions which apply to transportation from Empire Materials into

the San Fernando Valley area are substantially the same as those which apply to similar transportation from competing plants from which zone rates are in effect. Upon consideration of the record now before it, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that extension of the zone system of rates as proposed is necessary to and justified by the maintenance of reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates for the transportation involved. In the circumstances shown a presentation of costs, as urged by the California Trucking Associations, Inc., is not necessary. The petition will be granted.

The precise location of the plant of Empire Materials is in an area now designated in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 as Los Angeles County Production Area CC, said area being defined as "the southwest quarter of Section 18, Township 4 North, Range 15 West, San Bernardino Base and Meridian." The zone rates hereinafter provided will be made to apply from this area. With the establishment of said rates, distance rates will continue to apply to deliveries of asphaltic concrete from the plant of Empire Materials to points intermediate to the delivery zones in the San Fernando Valley. In some instances it appears that the distance rates to the intermediate points would result in higher transportation charges than would accrue under the zone rates to the more distant points. In order that there may be no violation of the long- andshort-haul prohibitions of Section 21, Article XII of the State Constitution, a rule will be provided to the effect that in the instances described the zone rates will supersede the distance rates when they result in lower transportation charges for the same transportation in the same direction over the same route.
