ORDER


The City of Santa Clara is authorized to construct the extension of De La Cruz Boulevard to U.S. Highway No. 101 at separated grades over the track of the Southern Pacific Company, in the City of Santa Clara, Santa Clara County, at the location as shown by map (Exhibit B) attached to the application as amended, to be identified as Crossing No. E-44.0-A. Construction shall be substantially as indicated in the application as amended. Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties relative thereto, and copy of said agreement, together with plans of said crossing approved by the Southern Pacific Company, shall be filed with the Commission within 180 days from the date hereof. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order. Clearances shall conform to the provisions of General Order 26-D. During the period of construction applicant is authorized to create an impaired clearance of 20' 0" above top of Southern Pacific rail and Southern Pacific Company is authorized to operate with such clearance provided it issues appropriate notices


to employees, advising them of the impaired clearance condition and forbidding them from riding on the tops of cars while operating beneath the structure.


Upon completion of the De La Cruz Boulevard overpass, Crossing No. E-44.3, Brokaw Road crossing at grade, shall be abandoned and closed.


Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within two years unless time be extended or if conditions are not complied with. The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
