SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

By Decision No. 56448, dated April 1, 1958, Earnest E. Delaplane, doing business as Peninsula Delivery & Transport Co., was granted exemption from the minimum rates established in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2. Pursuant to his request, Delaplane's radial highway common carrier permit was suspended for the period July 25, 1958 to July 24, 1959. It has come to the Commission's attention in proceedings in Case No. 5432, Petition No. 115, that Charles C. Camlas has acquired the motor vehicle equipment operated by Earnest Delaplane and is conducting the operation of Peninsula Delivery & Transport Co. Charles C. Camlas has been granted exemption from the minimum rates in order to continue the Peninsula Delivery & Transport Co. parcel delivery operation.

It appears that Earnest Delaplane is no longer engaged in the business of transporting property. In the circumstances, the exemption granted in Decision No. 56448 should be revoked.

Good cause appearing, IT IS ORDERED that Decision No. 52199, in Case No. 5432, as amended, is further amended by deleting from the list of carriers in Appendix B thereof, Earnest E. Delaplane, doing business as Peninsula Delivery & Transport Co.
