SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

This Commission having issued Decision No. 55974 dated December 16, 1957, in Application No. 3346, and providing therein, among other things, that the Southern Pacific Company shall obtain approval of the Department of Public Utilities and Transportation of the City of Los Angeles, for any train movements in excess of two made on Alameda Street between the hours of 2 p.m. and 4 p.m.; this Commission also having issued Decision No. 57286 dated September 2, 1958, in Case No. 6091, directing the Southern Pacific Company "to cease and desist from any further violations of Decision No. 55974, dated December 16, 1957, in Application No. 3346," and it now appearing that there is some question as to whether Decision No. 57286 conflicts with the provision of Decision No. 55974 authorizing two train movements along Alameda Street between the hours of 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. without the approval of the Department of Public Utilities and

Transportation of the City of Los Angeles, and good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, shall obtain permission of the Department of Public Utilities and Transportation of the City of Los Angeles for any train movements in excess of two made along Alameda Street between the hours of 2 p.m. and 4 p.m.

With this clarification the provisions of Decision No. 55974, supra, and Decision No. 57286, supra, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
