## <u>order</u>

Southern Pacific Company is authorized to reclassify Butterfly Lane (Crossing No. E-373.4) over the Coast Route in Santa Barbara County to a pedestrian crossing, to be reidentified as Crossing No. E-373.4-D, provided barricades are installed to effectively prevent the passage of vehicular traffic across the track. Upon erection of the barricades, applicant is further authorized to remove the existing Standard No. 3 wigwag signal.

Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost between lines two feet outside of rails. Santa Barbara County shall bear maintenance cost outside of such lines. Width of crossing shall be reduced to not more than 10 feet and grades of approach shall not exceed three per cent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 1 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by one Standard No. 1 crossing sign (General Order No. 75-B).

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Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
