OPINION AND ORDER

Charles H. Loveland holds a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing the transportation of property as a highway common carrier between Madera and Fish Camp. The certificate is limited to shipments not exceeding 100 pounds.

By letter dated October 23, 1958, Loveland requests that his highway common carrier certificate be revoked. He states that gross operating revenue for the past year was less than \$400; that his business consisted largely of transporting laundry, dry cleaning, and bakery products; that this business has been lost to proprietary service which provides daily deliveries; and that there is no other traffic available.¹

In the circumstances, it appears that public convenience and necessity no longer require highway common carrier service by Charles H. Loveland. The certificate will be revoked and all effective tariffs on file in the name of Charles H. Loveland will be canceled. A public hearing is not necessary.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity acquired by Charles H. Loveland by Decision No. 39875


dated January 21, 1947, in Application No. 27944, is hereby revoked and all effective tariffs on file in the name of Charles H. Loveland are hereby canceled.


The Secretary of the Commission is hereby directed to cause a certified copy of this order to be served upon Charles H. Loveland in the manner prescribed by law.




