SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

It appearing that there may be a conflict between a provision of General Order No. 100-A and Sections 3632, 3982 and 5162 of the Public Utilities Code, that said possible conflict should be eliminated, that the obligations of regulated carriers will not be materially changed by the following order and therefore public hearing is not necessary,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Case No. 5719 be, and it is, reopened.
2. Paragraph (5) of the Commission's General Order No. 100-A, adopted October 1, 1957 to be effective January 1, 1958 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(5) Any highway common carrier or petroleum irregular route carrier, desiring to furnish equivalent protection to the public by means other than those prescribed in the foregoing sections, whether as a self-insurer or otherwise, shall file an application for authority to do so in accordance with the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure."

3. As herein amended General Order No. 100-A is continued in full force and effect.

4. Case No. 5719 be, and it is, discontinued.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
