O P I N I O N

By this application filed October 9, 1958, L P G Transportation Corp. requests an order authorizing it to include, in its ten routes, the right to operate over and along U. S. Highway 101 Alternate, as well as along U. S. 101 and 101 By-Pass which are now included. U. S. Highway 101 Alternate lies within the fifty-mile lateral rights of applicant. Consequently the addition of this route will not constitute an addition to the territory to be served.

None of applicant's competitors will be adversely affected by the following order, but it may have the effect of permitting economies in operation. A public hearing appears to be unnecessary. Applicant's request will be granted by amending the second ordering paragraph of Decision No. 42849, dated May 10, 1949, in Application No. 29841, by adding the route U. S. Highway 101 Alternate, which extends from a point approximately three miles north of Oxnard along the Coast south to its junction, with U. S. Highway 101 about three miles west of San Juan Capistrano.

O R D E R

Application therefore having been filed and the Commission being of the opinion that application No. 40499 should be granted,

IT IS ORDERED that route description numbered 1 in ordering paragraph (2) of said Decision No. 42849 is amended to read: "1.

U. S. 101, U. S. 101 Alternate and U. S. 101 By-Pass between San Francisco and the California-Mexican Line;"

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, in providing service pursuant to the foregoing authority, applicant shall comply with the following service regulations:

- (a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted.
- (b) Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and shall file in triplicate, and concurrently make effective, tariffs and time schedules satisfactory to the Commission to reflect the authority herein granted.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
