ORDER SUSPENDING OPERATIVE RIGHTS

By Decision No. 44825, dated September 19, 1950, in this proceeding, Warren H. Desper, doing business as Desper Terminal & Distributing Company, was granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier for the transportation of crated new furniture between the Los Angeles drayage area, on the one hand, and various points and places in southern California, on the other hand.

It has been brought to the attention of the Commission by its Transportation Division that the liability insurance policy of Warren H. Desper required by General Order 100-A became canceled effective November 23, 1958, and has not been reinstated. The Commission is of the opinion and finds that failure of Warren H. Desper to have on file the requisite evidence of liability insurance constitutes good and sufficient grounds for suspension of the certificate. The certificate of public convenience and necessity and tariffs applicable in connection therewith will be suspended.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted to Warren H. Desper, doing business as Desper Terminal &

Distributing Company, by Decision No. 44825, dated September 19, 1950, in Application No. 31268, is suspended until further order of the Commission.

(2) That Western Motor Tariff Bureau, Inc., Agent, and Western Classification Committee, Agent, are hereby authorized and directed to suspend the participation of Warren H. Desper, doing business as Desper Terminal & Distributing Company, from their tariffs on file with this Commission, such suspension to be made effective within thirty days after the effective date of this order on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

The Secretary of the Commission is hereby directed to cause a certified copy of this order to be served upon Warren H. Desper in the manner prescribed by law.

The effective date of this order shall be the twentieth day after lawful service thereof upon Warren H. Desper unless, before such effective date, he shall have filed with this Commission a written response to this order denying the facts set forth herein, in which event the effective date of this order shall be stayed until further order of the Commission.
