

ORIGINALDecision No. 58052

BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Application of Peerless Stages, Incorporated, a corporation, for authority to operate bus service over a new alternate route between the City of Hayward and the City of Warm Springs, California, on and along the Eastshore Freeway.

O P I N I O N

Peerless Stages, Incorporated, rendering a passenger stage service between points within the State, requests authority to employ the Eastshore Freeway as an alternate route between Mt. Eden and Warm Springs. Applicant already has authority over this freeway between Oakland and Mt. Eden and between Warm Springs and San Jose.

Applicant alleges that it now operates certain express schedules between Oakland and San Jose which make no intermediate stops. If the requested authority is granted such schedules may be expedited without in any way affecting the services now rendered.

Copies of the application were served upon Greyhound Lines, Inc., Western Greyhound Lines Division, the State Highway Engineer (Department of Public Works, Division of Highways), the County of Alameda and the Cities of Hayward and Fremont. No protest has been received.

After consideration the Commission is of the opinion and finds that public convenience and necessity require the granting of the application.

O R D E R

Application having been filed and the Commission being informed in the premises,

IT IS ORDERED that:

(1) Route No. 1, described in Decision No. 35763, dated September 15, 1942, in Application No. 25206, as amended to date, be, and it is, hereby further amended by adding the following:

(m) Commencing at the intersection of Jackson Street and the Eastshore Freeway, thence along said Eastshore Freeway to the intersection of State Highways Nos. 9 and 17 (known as Warm Springs Junction). Applicant shall make no stops on the Eastshore Freeway except at regular turnouts established and constructed for that purpose.

(2) Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and shall file in triplicate and concurrently make effective tariffs and timetables satisfactory to the Commission to reflect the authority herein granted.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
