OPINION

Jake Stokes and Johnson McMurphy, doing business as Swanson's Trucking Service, acquired the business of Valley Refrigerated Lines, Inc. prior to April 29, 1955, and will be substituted as applicants in Application No. 36363.

Both companies engaged in the transportation of property in California pursuant to permits issued by this Commission.

Applicants seek an order authorizing them to conduct service as a highway common carrier for the transportation of general and special commodities through a wide area (for some commodities all) of the state.

Notice of filing of the application was given all common carriers subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.

operate as a highway common carrier as defined by Section 213 of the Public Utilities Code for the transportation of property between the points and over the routes as more particularly set forth in Appendices A and B attached hereto and made a part hereof.

- (4) That in providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicants shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:
 - (a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicants shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted. By accepting the certificate of public convenience and necessity herein granted, applicants are placed on notice that they will be required, among other things, to file annual reports of their operations and to comply with and observe the safety rules and other regulations of the Commission's General Order No. 99. Failure to file such reports, in such form and at such time as the Commission may direct, or to comply with and observe the provisions of General Order No. 99, may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.
 - (b) Within sixty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, applicants shall establish the service herein authorized and file in triplicate, and concurrently make effective, tariffs satisfactory to the Commission.

The effective date of this order shall be ninety days after the date hereof.

Appendix A Jake Stokes and Johnson McMurphy Original Page 1 Jake Stokes and Johnson McMurphy, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, are authorized to transport: 1. General commodities between All points and places in Stanislaus County; San Francisco territory as described on Appendix B hereto attached on the one hand and all points and places in the County of Stanislaus on the other hand. 2. Commodities requiring the use of refrigeration or temperature control in all or part of the year, and canned goods, between Stanislaus County on the one hand and Los Angeles on the other hand. 3. Canned goods between Turlock and Modesto on the one hand and Stockton on the other hand. Cement between Kentucky House, Permanente and San Juan Bautista on the one hand and Stanislaus County on the other hand. The terms used in this order have the following meanings: Stanislaus County includes all points in that county including all incorporated cities therein. **(b)** San Francisco territory means the area described on Appendix B hereto attached. Canned goods means all those commodities enumerated in either Item 610-0, of this Commission's Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 or Item 210-J of exception Sheet 1-S to Western Classification No. 76 of Pacific Southcoast Freight Bureau, agent. (d) Cement means all those commodities enumerated in Item No. 40, of this Commission's Minimum Rate Tariff No. 10. Issued by California Public Utilities Commission. 58054 Decision No. _, Applications Nos. 36063 and 36363.

6. Applicants shall not establish through routes or joint rates between San Francisco territory on the one hand and Los Angeles territory or Stockton on the other hand, nor between Los Angeles territory and Stockton.

Under authority granted by paragraphs 1(a) and 1(b), applicant shall not transport any shipments of:

- Used household goods and personal effects not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in paragraph (d) of Item No. 10-C of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 4-A.
- 2. Automobiles, trucks and buses; viz., new and used, finished or unfinished passenger automobiles (including Jeeps), ambulances, hearses and taxis; freight automobiles, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trailers combined, buses and bus chassis.
- 3. Livestock; viz., bucks, bulls, calves, cattle, cows, dairy cattle, ewes, goats, hogs, horses, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags or swine.
- 4. Liquids, compressed gases, commodities in semiplastic form and commodities in suspension in liquids in bulk, in tank trucks, tank trailers, tank semitrailers or a combination of such highway vehicles.
- 5. Commodities when transported in bulk in dump trucks or in hopper-type trucks.
- 6. Commodities when transported in motor vehicles equipped for mechanical mixing in transit.
- 7. Fruit, fresh, not cold pack or frozen.
- 8. Vegetables, fresh, not cold pack or frozen.

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APPENDIX B TO DECISION NO. 58654

SAN FRANCISCO TERRITORY includes all the City of San Jose and that area embraced by the following boundary: Beginning at the point the San Francisco-San Mateo County Boundary Line meets the Pacific Ocean; thence easterly along said boundary line to a point I mile west of U. S. Highway 101; southerly along an imaginary line I mile west of and paralleling U. S. Highway 101 to its intersection with Southern Pacific Company right of way at Arastradero Road; southeasterly along the Southern Pacific Company right of way to Pollard Road; easterly along Pollard Road to W. Parr Avenue; easterly along W. Parr Avenue to Capri Drive; southerly along Capri Drive to E. Parr Avenue; easterly along E. Parr Avenue to the Southern Pacific Company right of way; southerly along the Southern Pacific Company right of way to the Campbell-Los Gatos city limits; easterly along said limits and the prolongation thereof to the San Jose-Los Gatos Road; northeasterly along San Jose-Los Gatos Road to Forworthy Avenue; easterly along Foxworthy Avenue to Almadon Road; southerly along Almaden Road to Hillsdale Avenue; easterly along Hillsdale Avenue to U. S. Highway 101; northwesterly along U. S. Highway 101 to Tully Road; northeasterly along Tully Road to White Road; northwesterly along White Road to McKee Road; southwesterly along McKee Road to Capitol Avenue; northwesterly along Capitol Avenue to State Highway 17 (Oakland Road); northerly along State Highway 17 to Warm Springs; northerly along the unnumbered highway via Mission San Jose and Miles to H ayward; northerly along Foothill Boulevard to Seminary Avenue; easterly along Seminary Avenue to Mountain Boulevard; northerly along Mountain Boulevard and Moraga Avenue to Estates Drive; westerly along Estates Drive, Harbor Drive and Broadway Terrace to College Avenue; northerly along College Avenue to Dwight Way; casterly along Dwight Way to the Berkeley-Oakland boundary line; northerly along said boundary line to the campus boundary of the University of California; northerly and westerly along the campus boundary of the University of California to Euclid Avenue; northerly along Euclid Avenue to Marin Avenue; westerly along Marin Avenue to Arlington Avenue; northerly along Arlington Avenue to U. S. Highway 40 (San Pablo Avenue); northerly along U. S. Highway 40 to and including the City of Richmond; southwesterly along the highway extending from the City of Richmond to Point Richmond; southerly along an imaginary line from Point Richmond to the San Francisco Waterfront at the foot of Market Street; westerly along said waterfront and shore line to the Pacific Ocean; southerly along the shore line of the Pacific Ocean to point of beginning.
