O R D E R

State of California, Department of Public Works, is authorized to construct County Road 104 at separated grades over the tracks of Southern Pacific Company, near Swingle, Yolo County, at the location as shown by map (Exhibit B) attached to the application, to be identified as Crossing No. A-78.1-A. Construction shall be substantially as indicated in the application. Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties relative thereto, and copy of said agreement, together with plans of said crossing approved by Southern Pacific Company, shall be filed with the Commission within 180 days from the date hereof. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order. Clearances shall conform to the provisions of General Order No. 26-D.

Upon the completion of crossing at separated grade, the existing crossing at grade (Crossing No. A-78.1) shall be abandoned and removed. Also an existing private grade crossing located near Milepost 77.3 shall be abandoned and removed by railroad.

The County of Yolo has agreed to the vacating of County Road 103 across Southern Pacific Company right of way. Upon completion of crossing at separated grade, Crossing No. A-77.0 (County Road 103) shall be abandoned and removed by railroad.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within two years unless time be extended or if conditions are not complied with. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
