ORDER SUSPENDING OPERATIVE RIGHTS

Liberty Freight Lines, a corporation, possesses a highway common carrier certificate authorizing operations for the transportation of specified commodities between Los Angeles, on the one hand, and the San Francisco Territory as described in Appendix "B" to Decision No. 55380, in Application No. 36385, on the other hand.

The liability insurance policy of Liberty Freight Lines lapsed as of May 1, 1959. Evidence of liability protection required by General Order No. 100A not being on fike, and the Commission being of the opinion and finding that such failure constitutes good cause for suspension of such certificate and of tariffs applicable to service thereunder,

IT IS ORDERED as follows:

(1) The certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier granted to Liberty Freight Lines by Decision No. 55380 dated August 5, 1957, in Application No. 36385 is suspended pending further order.

(2) All tariffs issued by or on behalf of Liberty Freight Lines are suspended pending further order. A copy of this order shall be filed with said tariffs in the office of the Commission.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon Liberty Freight Lines and a copy

of this order to be mailed to Western Classification Committee, Agent, and Western Motor Tariff Bureau, Inc., Agent.

The effective date of this order shall be the fifth day after such service, unless before such effective date Liberty Freight Lines shall have filed with this Commission evidence of insurance protection as required by General Order No. 100A, in which event the effective date of this order shall be stayed until further order of the Commission.
