O P I N I O N

This phase of Case No. 5432 is one of several dealing with possible revisions of the various commodity rates, rules, and regulations named in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2. This particular proceeding concerns the rates for the transportation of beverages and tonics and the return of empty containers.

Public hearing was held before Examiner William E. Turpen on March 17 and 18, 1959, at San Francisco. Evidence was presented by a transportation engineer and by a rate expert of the Commission's staff. A cost study was also presented by a witness on behalf of the California Brewers Association. Representatives of the California Trucking Associations participated in the development of the record.

At present, Item No. 600 of the tariff provides point-to-point commodity rates on beer and other beverages, subject to

minimum weight of 18,000 pounds, between San Francisco Territory and Sacramento, on the one hand, and Fresno and Los Angeles Territory on the other hand. Between other points, the fifth-class mileage rates apply, subject to a minimum weight of 30,000 pounds. On less-than-truckload shipments, a fourth-class exception rating applies. Other than for general rate increases, no significant changes have been made in Item No. 600 for over twenty years. The present applicable rate or rating on returning empty containers can be found in either Items Nos. 330 or 600 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 or in the Western Classification, depending on the weight of the shipment and the distance transported.

The Commission engineer presented in evidence and explained a study he had made of the cost of transporting truckload quantities of beer and empty containers returning by motor vehicle. Information was obtained from the books and records of carriers performing this type of service. Time studies were conducted of loading and unloading operations at the breweries and at distributor warehouses. Separate costs were developed for the carriers serving the San Francisco area breweries and the Los Angeles area breweries. Costs are shown for various mileage distances and for the point-to-point movement between the San Francisco Territory and the Los Angeles Territory.

A representative of an accounting firm, employed by the California Brewers Association, also introduced in evidence a cost study his firm had prepared. His study was in the same format as that of the staff engineer; and although there were some small differences in the basic figures and methods of development, the two cost studies produced end results that were almost identical.

The rate expert explained an exhibit which he introduced into evidence in which he proposed revisions in the rates and ratings applicable to the transportation of beer and empty containers

returning. The witness stated that the other commodities named in Item No. 600 in addition to malt beverages either do not move by for-hire carriers or are adequately provided for elsewhere in the tariff.^{1/} He therefore left these commodities out of his recommendations. The witness recommended that the commodity rates on malt beverages be canceled and that an exception rating of Class D, subject to a minimum weight of 40,000 pounds, be established. Under this proposal the present exception ratings of fourth class on less-than-truckload, and fifth class on shipments of 30,000 pounds, will continue to apply. This proposal would result in substantial reductions from the present rates on the heavier shipments. Insofar as empty containers returning are concerned, the rate expert proposed that an exception rating of Class D, minimum weight 20,000 pounds, be established. For distances over 150 constructive miles, this would result in increases over the present rates. However, the rate expert's exhibit shows that, for longer distances, the present rates for empty containers are less than the costs of performing the service.

The witness stated that the malt beverages and their empty returning carriers are handled in a like manner and in like equipment and have transportation characteristics similar to those of other commodities for which class rates apply, and that the levels of the proposed class rates reflect the density and value of the commodity, the methods of handling, the frequency of movement, and other transportation conditions and the costs of performing the service.

The California Brewers Association supported the staff-proposed tariff and rate changes, and the California Trucking Associations offered no objections to the proposals.

^{1/} These include beverages, carbonated or not carbonated; extracts; fruit juice; ginger ale; soda; syrups; and water.

From a careful examination of the evidence of record, we are of the opinion and find that the changes in the minimum rates, rules, and regulations, as proposed by the rate expert in this proceeding, and which are established in the order which follows, are justified; that the minimum rates, rules, and regulations as so changed are and will be just, reasonable, and nondiscriminatory minimum rates for the transportation of the commodities here involved; and that the increases required to be made or authorized to be made by said order are justified.

O R D E R

Based upon the evidence of record and upon the findings and conclusions set forth in the preceding opinion,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 (Appendix "D" of Decision No. 31606 as amended) be and it is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective June 26, 1959, the revised pages attached hereto and listed in Appendix "A", also attached hereto, which pages and appendix by this reference are made a part hereof.

(2) That tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the effective date hereof, on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public, and that such tariff publications shall be made effective not later than June 26, 1959; and that tariff publications which are authorized but not required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the tariff changes herein involved.

(3) That common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the increased rates authorized hereinabove, be and they are authorized to depart from the provisions of Article XII, Section 21, of the Constitution, and Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code, to the extent necessary to adjust long-and-short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; that such outstanding authorizations be and they are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and that schedules containing the commodity descriptions published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long-and-short-haul departures and to this order.

(4) That in all other respects said Decision No. 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
