ORDER OF REVOCATION

By Decision No. 53781 dated September 18, 1956, in Application No. 38202, S.H.S. Enterprises, Inc., doing business under the name of Almaden Stage Lines, was authorized to establish a passenger stage service between the City of San Jose and Almaden. These operating rights are set forth in Appendix A of Decision No. 53781. Acquisition of said rights, title and interest is evidenced by tariff adoption notice filed by S.H.S. Enterprises, Inc., effective October 10, 1956.

By letter received April 21, 1959, Norman W. Holmes, sole owner and manager of said corporation, states that due to financial losses it was necessary for him to discontinue service. He states that this action was necessary in order to sustain the balance of his operations. He is also presently doing business as Mayfair Suburban Lines.

A recent study by the Commission staff estimated that the Almaden Stage Lines would have revenue of \$1,100 and operating expenses of \$3,440 for the year 1959. Under this same study it was estimated the Mayfair Suburban Lines would receive \$51,150 in revenue and experience \$58,630 in expenses.
