SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 contains minimum rates, rules, and regulations governing the transportation of rock, sand, gravel, and related items in dump truck equipment between points in California. Section No. 3 thereof provides, among other things, the description of delivery zones.

By this petition the County of San Joaquin requests the enlargement of San Joaquin County Delivery Zone No. 2 to include the county corporation yard in Stockton. The petition alleges that the higher minimum rates now applicable to and from the county corporation yard place an unwarranted burden on the taxpayers of San Joaquin County as compared to the rates applicable to the nearby private commercial distribution yards.

The petition shows that on or about March 31, 1959, a copy was served on the California Trucking Associations, Inc., and the California Dump Truck Owners Association, Inc. No objection to its being granted has been received.

The corporation yard in question is situated within the City of Stockton. It comprises an area of about twenty city blocks, and is immediately adjacent to San Joaquin County Delivery Zone No. 2. The yard is not included within any present delivery zone. As a result, zone-tonnage rates which apply to commercial plants in the adjacent delivery zone do not apply on aggregates transported to the corporation yard. Instead, the amplicable rates are distance-tonnage or hourly rates, either of which generally result in higher charges than the zone rates.

C. 5437 (Pet. for Mod. No. 50) -LM In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that the proposal is reasonable and justified. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 will be revised accordingly. The petition will be granted. A public hearing is not necessary. Therefore, good cause appearing, IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 (Appendix "A" to Decision No. 32566, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective June 29, 1959, First Revised Page 33-R, which revised page is attached hereto and made a part hereof by this reference.

(2) In all other respects, said Decision No. 32566, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
