SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

In Decision No. 58595 dated June 16, 1959, ordering paragraph (1) reads as follows:

"(1) That the Radial Highway Common Carrier Permit No. 49-1841 and the Highway Contract Carrier's Permit No. 49-1830 issued to Jameson Truck Lines, also known as Roy Jameson & Son, are hereby suspended for five consecutive days starting at 12:01 a.m. on the second Monday following the effective date of this order, except that said suspension will not apply to the transportation of fresh milk.

This paragraph should be amended in part to change the effective date of the ordered suspension.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that ordering paragraph (1) of Decision No. 58595 is amended in part to read as follows:

"(1) That the Radial Highway Common Carrier Permit No. 49-1841 and the Highway Contract Carrier's Permit No. 49-1830 issued to Jameson Truck Lines, also known as Roy Jameson & Son, are hereby suspended for five consecutive days starting at 12:01 a.m. on Monday, July 6, 1959,

except that said suspension will not apply to the transportation of fresh milk."

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
