#### OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant holds radial highway common, highway contract and city carrier permits, and a highway common carrier certificate. Prior orders in Application No. 37702 authorized applicant, as a highway contract carrier, to assess rates less than the applicable minimum rates for shipments of frozen pies, cakes and cookie rolls for the Carnation Company from the Los Angeles Territory to San Francisco Territory, Fresno, Sacramento, Chico and certain intermediate points, and fresh frozen fruits and berries from certain of the aforenamed places and Watsonville to the Los Angeles Territory. The authority is scheduled to expire July 30, 1959.

By this application, authority is sought to continue to deviate from the minimum rates for a further one-year period but to increase the currently authorized surcharge from seven percent to eight percent. Authority is also requested to include "frozen dough" on northbound movements at the sought rates.

Applicant states that there has continued to be a substantial movement of the traffic embraced herein and that the operation has been conducted at a profit under the authorized rates during

By Decision No. 57064 of July 29, 1958, in Application No. 37702 (Third Supplemental) applicant's radial highway common carrier permit was conditioned to exclude the transportation involved herein. Applicant's highway common carrier certificate does not apply to transportation between the points involved herein.

the past year. The application recites that applicant has experienced certain increases in the cost of operation and that the proposed increase in the surcharge will offset the increased operating cost.

The applicant asserts that the shipper, Carnation Company, has developed and is preparing to market a new product known as frozen dough. The product will be shipped from the same plant and to the same consignees as are the frozen pies, cakes and cookie rolls. According to the application, frozen dough generally possesses more favorable transportation characteristics than the commodities covered by the current authority. The Transportation Division staff has reviewed the verified application and has recommended that it be granted.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that the proposed rates are reasonable. This is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary. The application will be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED:

- (1) That Gould Transportation Co., Inc., operating as a highway contract carrier is hereby authorized to transport frozen cakes, frozen pies, frozen cookie rolls, and frozen dough, in straight or mixed shipments, and fresh frozen fruits and fresh frozen berries for Carnation Company at less than the established minimum rates, but not less than those set forth in, and subject to, the provisions shown in Appendix "A" attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.
- (2) That the authority granted herein shall expire one year after the effective date of this order unless sooner canceled, changed or extended by order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective July 30, 1959.
