ORDER REVOKING OPERATIVE RIGHTS

By Decision No. 57797, dated December 30, 1958, in this proceeding, Cities Fuel Lines, a corporation, acquired a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier for the transportation of specified commodities, in bulk, in tank vehicles between points and places along designated routes.¹

Decision No. 57797, supra, ordered that in providing service pursuant to the certificate therein granted, Cities Fuel Lines shall, within the period therein specified, establish the service and file and concurrently make effective tariffs satisfactory to the Commission. The required tariffs not having been filed, and the Commission being of the opinion and finding that such failure constitutes good cause for the revocation of the certificate,

IT IS ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity acquired by Cities Fuel Lines by Decision No. 57797, dated December 30, 1958, in Application No. 40636, is hereby revoked.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon Cities Fuel Lines.

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The operating rights were initially granted to Empire Transportation Company by Decision No. 54013, dated October 30, 1956, in Application No. 35941.

The effective date of this order shall be the twentieth day after service thereof upon Cities Fuel Lines, unless before such effective date it shall have filed with this Commission a written response to this order denying the facts set forth herein, in which event the effective date of this order shall be stayed until further order of the Commission.
