ORDER SUSPENDING OPERATIVE RIGHTS

G. Q. Stong, doing business as Whitey Stong Trucking, possesses a petroleum irregular route carrier certificate authorizing the transportation of petroleum and petroleum products, in bulk, in tank trucks and tank trailers, between all points and places in the State of California. He also holds a certificate to operate as a highway common carrier for the transportation of the same commodities in the same type of equipment between specified points along certain authorized routes.

The liability insurance policy of G. Q. Stong lapsed as of July 1, 1959. Evidence of liability protection required by General Order No. 100A not being on file, and the Commission being of the opinion and finding that such failure constitutes good cause for suspension of such certificates and of tariffs applicable to services thereunder,

IT IS ORDERED as follows:


(1) The certificates of public convenience and necessity to operate as a petroleum irregular route carrier and as a highway common carrier granted to G. Q. Stong by Decision No. 55548, dated September 10, 1957, in Application No. 38932, are suspended pending further order.


(2) All tariffs issued by or on behalf of G. Q. Stong are suspended pending further order. A copy of this order shall be filed with said tariffs in the office of the Commission.


The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon G. Q. Stong and a copy of this order to be mailed to Western Motor Tariff Bureau, Inc., Agent.


The effective date of this order shall be the fifth day after such service, unless before such effective date G. Q. Stong shall have filed with this Commission evidence of insurance protection as required by General Order No. 100A, in which event the effective date of this order shall be stayed until further order of the Commission.
