BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Application of MARY GRACE MAST RICHEY, formerly MARY GRACE MAST, as Administratrix of the estate of VERNON A. MAST, deceased, EDITH A. MAST, Administratrix of the estate of ROY A. MAST, deceased, and LOWELL E. MAST, doing business as MAST IRON WAREHOUSE, for authority to transfer the interest of VERNON A. MAST, deceased, to MARY GRACE MAST RICHEY, formerly MARY GRACE MAST, JACK D. MAST and CALVIN COWLES MAST, and for authority to transfer the interest of ROY A. MAST, deceased, to EDITH A. MAST, and for LOWELL E. MAST, MARY GRACE MAST RICHEY, JACK D. MAST, CALVIN COWLES MAST and EDITH A. MAST to continue operation, under the provisions of Sections 851-853 of the Public Utilities Code.

O P I N I O N

Lowell E. Mast, Vernon A. Mast and Roy A. Mast were copartners engaged in the warehouse and grain cleaning business in Yolo County under the name and style of Mast Iron Warehouse.

Vernon A. Mast died on June 3, 1955, and Roy A. Mast died on October 9, 1955. By order of the Superior Court for Yolo County, dated November 5, 1956, the partnership interest of Roy A. Mast was distributed to Edith A. Mast. By order of the same court, dated September 10, 1957, the partnership interest of Vernon A. Mast was distributed to Mary Grace Mast Richey, Janet M. Hayes, Jack D. Mast and Calvin Cowles Mast. Janet M. Hayes subsequently conveyed her interest to Jack D. Mast and Calvin Cowles Mast.

Authority is requested to transfer the operating authority and assets of the warehouse operation to Lowell E. Mast, Edith A. Mast, Mary Grace Mast Richey, Jack D. Mast and Calvin Cowles Mast.

After consideration the Commission is of the opinion that the proposed transfer would not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

Application having been filed and the Commission being informed in the premises,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That on or before January 1, 1960 Mary Grace Mast Richey, as administratrix of the estate of Vernon A. Mast, Edith A. Mast, as administratrix of the estate of Roy A. Mast and Lowell E. Mast, may transfer the operating authority and public utility assets of the partnership formerly conducted by Lowell E. Mast, Vernon A. Mast and Roy A. Mast, doing business under the name of Mast Iron Warehouse, to Lowell E. Mast, Edith A. Mast, Mary Grace Mast Richey, Jack D. Mast and Calvin Cowles Mast.

(2) That, within thirty days after the consummation of the transfer herein authorized, applicants shall notify the Commission, in writing, of that fact and within said period shall file with the Commission a true copy of any instrument of transfer which may be executed to effect said transfer.

(3) That, on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public, effective concurrently with the consummation of such transfer, applicants shall amend or reissue the tariffs on file with the Commission, naming rates, rules and regulations governing the operations here involved, to show that the copartnership of Lowell E. Mast, Vernon A. Mast and Roy A. Mast has withdrawn or cancelled and that Lowell E. Mast, Edith A. Mast, Mary Grace Mast Richey, Jack D. Mast and Calvin Cowles Mast have adopted or established as their own said rates, rules and regulations. The tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
