ORDER SUSPENDING OPERATIVE RIGHTS Lincoln E. Cryne and Roy W. Blackwell, copartners, doing business as Ventura County Limousine Service, possess a certificate of public convenience and necessity to conduct passenger stage operations between Ventura and Oxnard and Los Angeles International Airport. By request filed with the Commission on July 9, 1959, the operators seek authority to suspend service for a period of 120 days. This request is made in order to allow time to properly reorganize their business, to purchase new equipment, and to obtain acceptable liability insurance and file evidence of same with the Commission. Evidence of liability insurance protection required by General Order No. 101 is not presently on file with the Commission. The Commission being of the opinion and finding that good cause for suspension of such certificate and of tariffs and timetables applicable to service thereunder exists, IT IS ORDERED as follows: The certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a passenger stage corporation granted to Lincoln E. Cryne and Roy W. Blackwell, copartners, by Decision No. 57865, dated January 13, 1959 in Application No. 40604, is suspended until appropriate notice and filings are received by the Commission, or in any event not later than November 9, 1959. - 1 -
