SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By the decisions bereinafter identified, Shippers Express Company acquired certificates which are described in part by reference to territorial descriptions contained in minimum rate tariffs. As the certificates are worded, some question may arise whether any amendments to the territorial descriptions of the minimum rate tariffs would be incorporated automatically into these certificates.

It is apparent that eny changes made by the Commission in the territorial descriptions set forth in the minimum rate tariffs are predicated on minimum rate considerations and not public convenience APPENDIX "A" TO DECISION NO.

Beginning at the point the San Francisco-San Mateo County Boundary Line meets the Pacific Ocean; thence easterly along said boundary line to a point 1 mile west of U.S. Highway No. 101; southerly along an imaginary line 1 mile west of and paralleling U.S. Highway No. 101 to its intersection with the corporate boundary of the City of San Jose; southerly, easterly and northerly along said corporate boundary to its intersection with State Highway No. 17; northerly along State Highway No. 17 to Warm Springs; northerly along the unnumbered highway via Mission San Jose and Niles to Hayward; northerly along Foothill Boulevard to Seminary Avenue; easterly along Seminary Avenue to Mountain Boulevard; northerly along Mountain Boulevard and Moraga Avenue to Estates Drive; westerly along Estates Drive, Harbor Drive and Broadway Terrace to College Avenue; northerly along College Avenue to Dwight Way; easterly along Dwight Way to the Berkeley-Oakland boundary line; northerly along said boundary line to the campus boundary of the University of California; northerly and westerly along the California; northerly and westerly along the campus boundary of the University of California to Buclid Avenue; northerly along Buclid Avenue to Marin Avenue; westerly along Marin Avenue to Arlington Avenue; northerly along Arlington Avenue to U.S. Highway No. 40 (San Pablo Avenue); northerly along Suthmenterly along the highway extending from the City of Richmond to Point Richmond; southerly along an imaginary line from Point Richmond to the San Francisco Waterfront at the foot of Market Street; westerly along said water front and shore line to the Pacific Ocean; southerly along the shore line of the Pacific Ocean to point of beginning.
